The boys continued to battle on against a very physical opponent and some questionable refereeing calls started to play with the boys' heads. A few successive tries from our opponents finally put the game into one team's favour for the first time in the game, and, although Finley Carter managed to pull a try back, it was just one too many for us. All 15 who played can be proud of their performances, and might be left wondering 'what if' had we taken a fully fit side with several subs. It was not to be however, and our attention now turns to winning the Plate Competition.
